GREEN INITIATIVES

Energy is the Borough's highest operating expense after salaries and benefits. The Borough is currently getting estimates for solar panels on the new DPW building, in the process of doing a light analysis to cut electric bills and planning an energy audit in the near future. I recently attended a Classic Towns Workshop in West Chester on the subject of reducing energy. Efficiency and conservation are very different. Efficiency, on the one hand, is energy efficient equipment, like a Toyota Prius; conservation, on the other hand, is turning out lights, lowering heat and a/c, using public transportation, walking, biking and carpooling.

The Classic Towns' energy expert recommended reducing our electricity usage, and estimated that 25-30% of municipal energy is wasted - keeping unused rooms heated, field light, idling trucks, etc. The most efficient equipment can be wasteful, e.g., leaving a car/truck on to keep it warm. Lighting upgrades have the fastest paybacks. Use sensors in common rooms - turn light level down in offices, corridors, use lower wattage, cut light level. HVAC used 40-60% of energy in U.S. buildings - don't oversize the system. AC should run 100% on the hottest days; heater should run 100% on coldest days.

Tree and Shrub Pruning Workshop

The proper way to prune trees and shrubs will be the topic of the first gardening workshop sponsored by the Haddon Heights Community Garden. The speaker will be Stephen Dorsey, a certified New Jersey Tree Expert with over 38 years of residential tree service experience. Trees and shrubs are an important part of our homes' landscaping. Proper pruning can promote health and improve appearance. Even old and overgrown shrubs can be renewed through proper pruning techniques. was that while the Borough is looking for ways to reduce its energy footprint, MOST of the greenhouse gases emitted in the Borough are produced by the residents!!! In 2005 the residents of West Chester Borough (7,000 year round, 4,000 college), which is slightly bigger than Haddon Heights at 1.8 square miles, produced 220,000 tons of CO2 emissions. If this was converted to a mountain of coal it would be 122' by 349' and four stories high!!! In Haddon Heights that would be bigger than Stanfill Towers! That would be our giant carbon "footprint."

To avoid the catastrophic effect of pollution and climate change, all of the residents of Haddon Heights have to conserve. Lower or turning out lights, walking to errands less than one mile, and bundling car trips is the answer to reducing our whole Borough footprint.

In the next year PSE&G will be installing a solar unit on utility poles in 300 rural and suburban communities in Southern New Jersey, possibly Haddon Heights. It will be the largest pole-attached solar installation in the world. When we hear more about this PSE&G program in the future, we will keep you informed. The Merry Muckers of the First Presbyterian Church of Haddon Heights are returning to Houma, Louisiana, in April, 2010, for their fifth Katrina Relief trip.

We have made four previous trips and done substantial work for the residents of Louisiana. The Merry Muckers raise all money needed for airfare, rental vehicles, room and board at a Presbyterian Disaster Relief (“PDA”) camp, and additional supplies needed at the homes we are assigned to. We have raised over \$45,000 the last four years and once again we are in the position of needing to raise a substantial amount of funds to cover our costs. We are anticipating a group 17 strong this year, with ages ranging from 40 to 80 years old. All the members going this year are returning members to the Merry Muckers.

This dedicated group of volunteers has provided over two thousand hours rebuilding a devastated area here in our

own great Country. The group works with TRAC, the organization that oversees Relief construction, in the surrounding parishes of New Orleans. We remain in contact with the families where we have worked the past four years. We continue to return not only because of the need that still remains, but also because they are so appreciative of what we do, they get into your hearts and blood and we return having received as much, if not more, back than what we were able to provide the families.

HADDON HEIGHTS KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

4. Copy of recent physical. If child has had a physical in the last six months, this will be acceptable. If not, please furnish one to the school nurse before school begins in September.

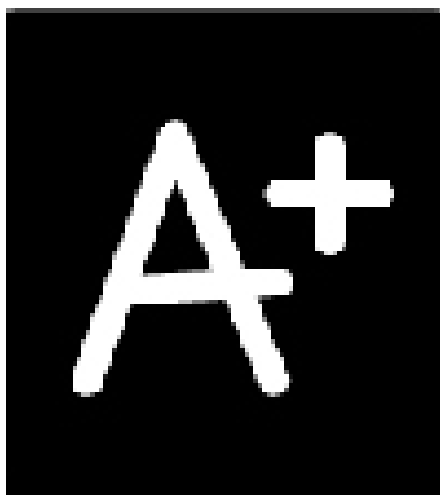
All of the above information must be provided before school begins in September.

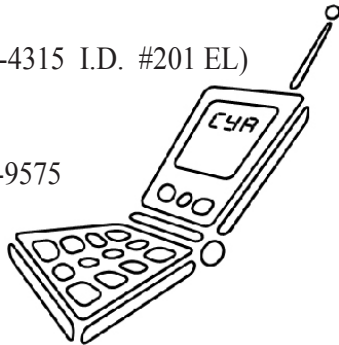

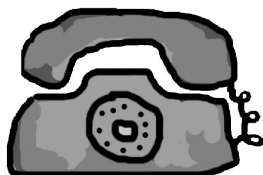
